

Pronouns

A pronoun is a word that takes the place of a noun.

Example: Raman is a mail carrier. Raman carries a blue bag.

To make the second sentence sound better, you can change the word *Raman* to *he*.

New sentence: Raman is a mail carrier. He carries a blue bag.

The word *he* is a pronoun that takes the place of the word *Raman*.

Some common pronouns include:

I, you, he, she, it, we, they, you, him, her, them, it, us
