Adjectives

- Adjectives are words that describe nouns or pronouns. Adjectives remain the same for singular and plural nouns or pronouns.

Example: Fared lost his favourite pen. He lost his favourite pencils too.

- An adjective may come before a noun or a pronoun or later in a sentence.

Example: I have an orange dress. The dress is long for me.
