Pollution has degraded environment and has damaged all our resources. At times, renewable sources like air, water and land have turned worthless because of pollution. Thus pollution can disturb every biological system that renews natural resources. It affects both living and non living resources. Our rivers, ponds and lakes are the victims of pollution. The rivers have become the dumping grounds for poisonous chemicals from factories, agricultural wastes, insecticides and even acids. The oceans too have not been spared. More than half the oil produced in the world is transported across oceans by ships and oil tankers. One part in a thousand of this is lost by spillage and leakage and as this oil does not evaporate easily, it accumulates year after year.
