Sub:-English

in direct speech, we reproduce the actual words of the speaker. These words are put in inverted commas.

To convert into indirect speech, we make the following changes:

- 1. Remove the inverted commas.
- 2. Omit the comma separating the reporting verb from the actual words.
- 3. Use 'that' to introduce the reported speech (statements).
- 4. Make changes in the verb unless it is a universal truth.
- 5. Make changes in the personal pronouns.
- 6. Make changes in words expressing nearness and time.
- 7. Change 'said to' into 'told to' if 'said' is followed by an object.
