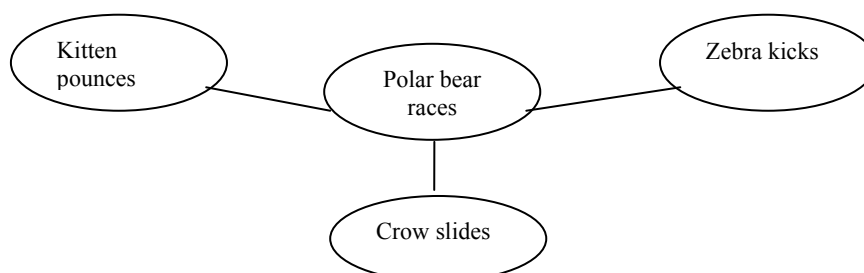
**Q4. Read the following passage carefully and answer the questions that follow:-**

In Atlantic waters of New England, a humpback whale does back flips near a whale-watching vessel. In New Zealand, a Kea parrot somersaults and swings on a tree branch. On an ice floe in the Canadian Arctic, two young polar bears race toward each other as if to attack—but instead, embrace and tumble through the snow. Here's one thing all these different animals have in common: they all like to play-- in different ways.

It is safe to say that many mammals and birds actually do play; if what we mean by "play" is that they engage in some activity for the sake of having what we call "fun." On the other hand, it is worth noting that many animals do *not* play.

Snakes, sharks and snails, for example, seem to have no sense of fun at all. Other animals do things that may look amusing to us but are probably not experienced as amusement by them. When hermit crabs duck in and out of holes on the beach, then scuttle across the sand side ways, they may look to us like a comic dance troupe playing hide-and-seek, but in fact they're only travelling, hunting, and trying to stay safe.

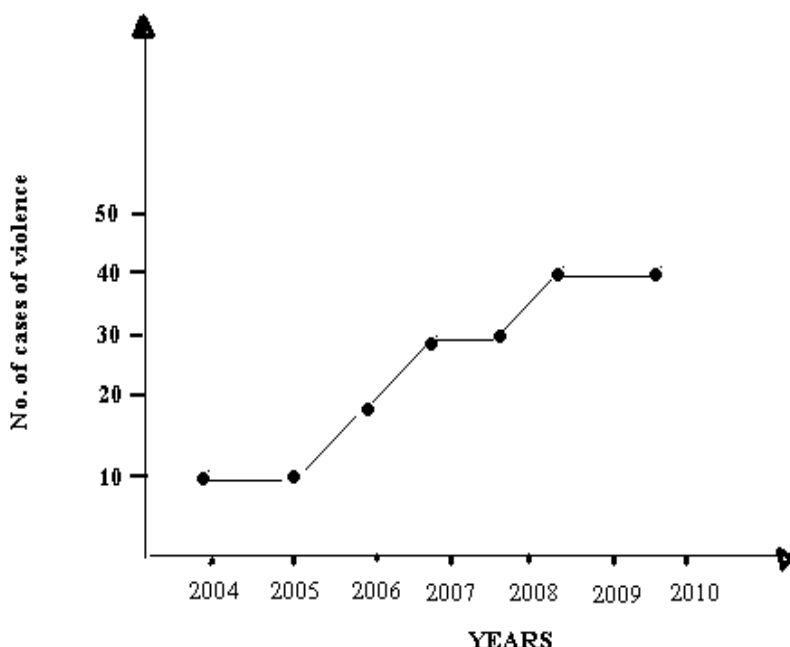

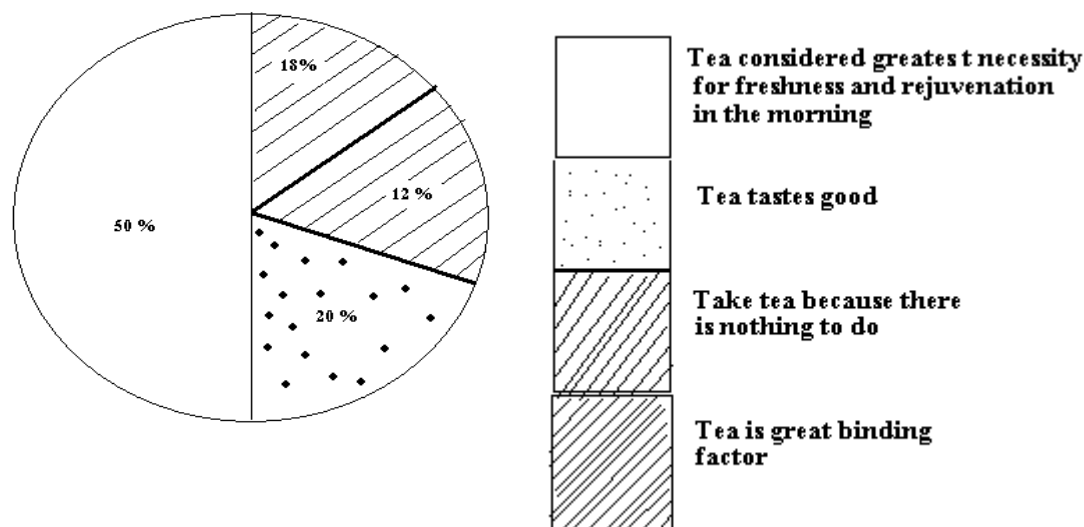
